

# **PRI Publishes Literature Reviews on Two Topics: (1) Community Violence as a Public Health Issue; (2) Community Engagement in K-12 Education: What Works?**

The project also included student presentations of their findings to PRI and the public, at UNO's Community Engagement Center in December, 2014.

We asked the students to address the following two topics of interest to PRI: (1) Community Violence as a Public Health Issue; (2) Community Engagement in K-12 Education: What Works? The class was split into 4 groups, producing 2 literature reviews on each topic.
